- A new recreation center for the City of Largo, Florida. Using Revit's 3D capabilities and a little Photoshop, I produced studies that helped move the project through design development. I was heavily involved in M/E/P and Structural coordination.

PRIOR TO THAT

- I helped design and build *Architecture* magazine's 2006 "Home of the Year" as a member Studio 804, the culmination of the University of Kansas's three-year M.Arch (III) program.
 - Worked a summer on design-build architect Dan Rockhill's construction crew digging ditches, scraping paint, grinding steel, and hauling gravel up precarious ramps (2004).
 - Founded the tiny literary magazine *Johnny America* with a couple of my best friends, which we design, edit, and publish to this day. We were recently awarded a grant by the Spencer Museum of Art and Kansas City's Charlotte Street Foundation, which we're using to publish the world's first scratch-and-sniff "Smell Your Own Adventure" story.
